"People get excited by the objects..."

Breath of life to the body, rhythmic, inflate, ephemera rising, light-as-cloud, vap'rous, overwhelm, scud, shift, the nylon/Tyvek giants, the horses, temporary, vulnerable, they fill the mind, part balloon, papery, crinkly, part sculpture, colossal, so you see the space they're in, the whirring of fans, the rising limbs, the sagging heads: lung, long, drawn up and out, architecture in dreams, you sense the space they're from, sleepers rising from the sheets, breathe, awake, alive.

He has shown widely across Canada in solo exhibitions in museums such as The Art Gallery of Ontario, Edmonton Art Gallery and the Mendel Art Gallery in Saskatoon.

He has completed several international siterelated projects in such places as Taichung, Taiwan, Erfurt, Germany and Prague, Czech Republic.

His inflatable works are in the collections of museums such as the ESSL Museum, Vienna, The Hara Museum, Tokyo and Beaverbrook Art Gallery, Fredericton.
