



SUPER SATURDAY AT HOME: SALMON RUN



Create a unique work of art inspired by our upcoming exhibition, *Sugarbush Shrapnel* opening September 24th with the Art+Earth Festival.

As the leaves start to change colour, the Art+Earth Festival gets closer, and adult salmon return inland for their annual **Salmon Run**. To celebrate these Autumn events, we're creating salmon collage suncatchers!




You will need:

- 1x [Super Saturday Art Kit](#) from CRAG
- A couple of heavy books
- Tape
- Scissors
- Optional: paint or markers



Steps:

1. **Forage for materials!** Take a walk in your backyard or a nearby park to find leaves and flowers. As you gather, think about the colours and textures you want to use. Below are the five types of Pacific salmon for inspiration OR invent a new type of salmon using your imagination!



2. **Dry those plants!** Lay your leaves and flowers inside a big, thick book and wait a few days for them to become dry and flat. A smaller book or even a newspaper can work if you don't have a big enough book, just put something heavy on top of it.

3. **Build your salmon!** Carefully peel off the white backing from the Con-Tact piece with a fish shape on it. Sticky side facing UP, tape the corners of the contact paper onto a flat surface (like a table). Fill the salmon body with colourful leaves and flowers, starting at the tail and working up towards the head.



Don't be afraid to tear leaves and flower petals with your hands. You can also cut them to create smaller shapes.

4. Seal it with a (fishy) kiss! Peel the back off the second piece of clear contact paper. Gently place this piece on top of your salmon collage, sticky sides facing together. Press out the air bubbles. Cut out the salmon, leaving 1cm around the outline.



5. Share your creation with the world! Tape your salmon to a window, admire the sun sparkling through it, and snap a photo.


